Obviously some people may nominate for more than 1 role, wether voted in as president or not I will nominate for Editor.

Committee meetings would continue to be held on the 4th Saturday at a time agreed to by the committee members. Support group members would be invited to attend meetings as required

Committee position roles are fairly obvious and are included in the Club Constitution. The support group roles are fairly easily defined.

The editor edits the Newsletter (note: edits not writes) and would be asking for contributions and regular articles.

The Program coordinators, one for each meeting, would be responsible for putting out <u>a joint program</u> at least 3 months in advance.

The Librarian maintains the Library.

The Equipment Officer maintains Equipment.

The Website Liaison keeps the website up to date and relevant.

Whilst the majority of the committee are predominately involved in the 4th Saturday meeting, a 2nd Saturday coordinator and probably an assistant is required.

The 2nd Woodgroup Delegate would attend Woodgroup meetings with the other delegate but would not be required to sit on committee meetings every month.

The Exhibition Committee Chair is for the NT Exhibition Committee and may or may not be involved with the Woodgroup Exhibition Committee.

The External Demonstration Coordinator would be responsible for coordinating, OR seconding another, to coordinate any external demonstration we, NT, are asked to be involved in eg Home Show. This person would be responsible for Liaising with the organisers of the event, programming demonstrators and making sure of delivery and return of all NT equipment.

Social Officer, do we want/need social events. It would be nice for someone to organise the BBQ at the AGM and the Xmas break up and maybe one other event during the year. Perhaps a pub night? Quiz nights are fun.

Also our constitution and by-laws are dated from 2007 and need to be reviewed, not necessarily changed, but definitely reviewed to ensure relevance.

I have suggested before about having a craft stall on a regular basis with a roster to man it, all it needs is a bit of coordination any volunteers?

Suggestions have been made re a third meeting?

Perhaps these could be specialised, not teaching, but like minded people to come along and swap ideas and techniques, eg pen makers, box makers. There would need to be a minimum number of participants but I think it could be done.

Competitions, yes we should have some. Monthly competitions with an end of year trophy. 3 grades, Advanced, Intermediate and Novice. I will expand on this more further down the page.

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Competition Ideas

This is sort of how I see it working:

Each member will be allocated to a group, regardless of wether they will be taking part in competitions or not, Advanced (eg TS, RA x2, GP etc they will be fairly easy to pick) Intermediate or Novice. (I suggest that all you Advanced turners out there put on your thinking caps as to who goes in which group.

TROPHY COMPETITION

Each member can then nominate if they wish to be involved in the trophy competition held from February to September. Those senior members who choose not to be involved will be Judges. Each month from January a task will be set and published in Turnout. Your piece will need to be handed in <u>by</u> 11am on the 4th Saturday for judging with a rolling score maintained. At the end of the year the top 2 advanced will become judges for the following year, the top 2 intermediate will become advanced and the top 2 novice will become intermediate. No one will be demoted. Unless otherwise specified each piece will be judged by 3 broad criteria; clarity (is it what it is supposed to be) individualism (sets it apart from others) and finish (the difference between good and great) Suggestions for pieces, wine goblet, inlaid lid box, pair of candle sticks, 200ml hollow form, 150ml decorated edge bowl, the perfect pen, and desk clock. 8 months 8 pieces, easy.

There will be other competitions throughout the year with members competing within their divisions for small prizes e.g. best copy following a demonstration to be judged by the demonstrator.

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LIBRARY MATTERS

We have a new DVD - Band Saws: Very useful viewing for new user/owners but also worthwhile for more experienced Woodies.

DVD Turning Projects with Richard Raffan (copy 1) is missing from case. Could someone have returned the empty case and left the DVD in machine by mistake?

LIBRARY USE: There is still a little confusion regarding the use of the library. It is run on the simplest method and if readers follow these steps there should be no confusion.

- 1. Select item. Fill in card and place in box provided.
- 2. When returning items, match up with card in box. Sign off with current date. Place card into item and replace on the library shelf

It can therefore be assumed that all cards in the box represent items which are currently in the possession of the last person to sign the card. If you are unsure if you have any items on loan please look through the cards in the box.

No items should be returned and placed on the shelf without the accompanying card.

Our library is an important asset and is well used. Please continue to borrow the items and enjoy, but please return them as soon as you are finished as others may wish to use them too.
