Hello everyone

Well, just over a month to go till SAturn no 14! At the moment we have 42 hardy souls booked in, which is a healthy number, although there is still room if anyone else would like to join us. Thank you all for your support – we are delighted to be holding our woodturning camp again this year, albeit on a different weekend.

We have a number of new participants, so I will explain the Challenge. This is a voluntary competition which we encourage you all to enter. It depends on creative and lateral thinking rather that woodturning skill, so everyone has a chance. The judges are the non-turners at the camp - usually me, the kitchen staff and one or two others. The non-turning judges appreciate excellence in turning, but they equally value ingenuity, cleverness, humour and bribes - so get those creative juices (and chocolates) flowing! The only requirement is that you make your Challenge entry at SAturn. So you can think and organise yourself as much as you like beforehand, but you must actually make it on the My favourite chocolates are Lindt bars. although I'm willing to accept others. This year Bastille Day (14th July) falls in the middle of our camp, so our theme is All Things French. Jeff and I spent a couple of weeks in France last month, so we are very excited by our theme. Think French food, monuments, history, artists - anything you like that has a connection to La Belle France! (no matter how tenuous). We will have a silent auction again this year. We are asking everyone to bring a woodturning-related item (timber, turned items, tools, books, magazines, anything vaguely relevant) as a donation. Each item will be given a number and \$2 is set as the minimum bid. You will be able to bid on any of the items till 10 am Sunday, BUT - if your item is not bid on, you pay \$5 to take it home! The aim is help defray some of the costs which keep rising every year - and have a bit of fun at the same time. Official starting time is 2 30 pm on Friday 13th -please note that El Shaddai have set this time and asked that it be honoured. Please come to the gym to unload. All meals will be provided from Friday night onwards. Friday's meal will be served at 6 pm, so please let us know if you will not be there by then. Finishing time will be after lunch on Sunday. Please note El Shaddai is a complete Alcohol and Smoke Free site. Make sure you

have told us of any dietary issues so we can look after you properly.

Something new: El Shaddai staff have requested that we provide a time for them to have a short input session on Christian values. This will be negotiated at the camp, and you are invited to attend.

This year again there will be no dishes to wash, just tables to set up before meals, so more time for turning. Don't forget to bring your ideas and gadgets to share! Things you need to bring - bedding (it will be cold), PILLOWS (not provided any more), turning tools (all clearly named or marked), wood, lathe if possible and lots of enthusiasm and encouragement. You are invited to bring some of your work to show in the gallery. We will also have a display of items turned during the weekend. Don't forget the camera, and most importantly, your dust and safety gear, including, if possible, screens for lathes. A reminder that, to keep dust down, there will be no power sanding.

There will be some polish and craft accessories available to purchase. There will also be some timber for sale, Tim Skilton is bound to have a sanding disc or two available, and the Woodfast boys will also be there. So we are well set up should you run out of anything! Saturday June 23rd

FOURTH SATURDAY MEETING (23 June)
TOPIC – USING RESINS WITH WOODTURNING.
At the SATURN meeting last year we were treated to a demonstration using resin by Brendan Stemp. Brendan is a professional woodturner from the Horsham district in Victoria. He has attended a number of the recent SATURN events and has always been available to all. He has experimented with embedding objects in resin as part of his woodturning especially using gum nuts and resin as part of his pepper mills. He has found a product called "Solid Cast" clear doming epoxy to be the most effective and had some for sale. We purchased some for the Northern Turners and set aside the June meeting for an opportunity to experience its use.

Many Northern Turners would have seen the beautiful platters with resin rims made by Graham Reed. Graham

has spent much time perfecting his processes. Others have since had a go.

The intention for this meeting is to have a go at a small piece as in lids for lidded boxes. They will need to be kept simple. To put a clear rim as in a platter requires two sessions – one to set a base and the second to imbed items using a second application of resin.

SO! What to bring. Try a lid from a lidded box or a piece which may end up as a lid. At the simplest prepare some pieces which have a recess 40 x 10 or so that you could embed some material with resin. These could be later turned to make a shallow cylinders which could be used for a number of purposes.

Lets use this session to experiment especially with objects to be embedded.

You might check out the web for ideas. I googled "Using resin in turning" and saw some interesting video clips by Tony Barefoot. See also Brendan Stemp's homepage. I also googled a page called embedding with resin which showed some videos not related to woodturning but which showed a number of interesting possible ideas. Please contribute to the session if you have had some experiences with Resin.

MASTER BUILDERS BUILDING AND HOME IMPROVEMENT SHOW

FRIDAY JULY 6 TO SUNDAY JULY 8, 2012

In a round about way I learned about the "Home Show" and Woodgroup SAs opportunities for 2012. I contacted the organisers – Kym Jones Exhibitions in relation to the International Wood Collectors and discovered that the organisers were not continuing with the Tools and More concept from last year. As a result they have condensed the site to fit into one pavilion and do not have the space available for the Woodgroup – its Exhibition and its large demonstration area. As a result there will be no Exhibition or Gallery as in past years and no large area for the Woodgroup to have all of the demonstrations as in the past. At the Woodgroup Board meeting at Kadina during the Merry Month of May we were informed that there was an allocation of 12 x 3 metres available for the

Woodgroup of which 3 x 3 metres was allocated to the Northern Turners. As a result it would seem that we could easily mount a demonstration site with two lathes. This is to make members aware and to try to establish a roster before the fourth Saturday meeting so that we can finalise arrangements at that meeting (less than two weeks before the Homeshow).

We are suggesting that we roster 3 members for each full day and those members work out the roster for that day between themselves. The organisers are seeking names by June 15th if possible. We will comply if practicable. If you are interest and available can you please advise Dennis Murray as soon as possible, letting him know of the day or days which you are available. We will be issued with passes as in past years.

To all Northern Turners

Firstly - I would like to pass on an update on Malcolm Juries recovery. As reported Malcolm was struck down with Guilliane Barr syndrome in February and was in for a long and hard battle to recover full health. I am pleased to say that Malcolm is now out of Memorial hospital and undergoing therapy etc as an inpatient at Hampstead. The original prognosis was that he would be incapacitated for most of the year with very slow recovery, but he is progressing extremely well and is expecting to become an outpatient in July with ongoing treatment three times a week. Still a long way to go, but great news to date.

Secondly. At our monthly meeting in February approval was given by the members present for Tim Skilton and Brian Purcell to pursue a guest demonstrator for another workshop in November 2012.

We are very pleased to advise you that another quality turner has been approached and is available for Saturday and Sunday the 3rd and 4th of November 2012.

Ironically his name is Neil Turner and he comes highly recommended by Vaughn Richmond, who is one of our past demonstrators and a highly accredited professionals. Richard has demonstrated alongside Neil several times in the last 2-3 years, and found him to be a very skilled operator who interacts well with his audience and explains matters very well, Like other professionals we have had, he is only too happy to share his knowledge and

techniques with like minded and interested people. Neil attended Turnfest in Queensland as a demonstrator in 2011 and has been invited back again this year, which is testament to his standard of presentation. He has supplied work to various Art Galleries around the world, including Del Mano and is preparing work for a solo exhibition at the Bunbury Regional Art Gallery. He has also judged the Denmarkl Award Exhibition at Denmark (Western Australia) last year and apparently did an excellent job. He is also active in demonstrating for the local woodturning clubs in WA.
