It was announced that the committee decided to present the Dick Pillar Award to Robert Edge, club treasurer for the past five years. Ken thanked Robert for his excellent work, highlighting the setup of the electronic payment system this year.

ANTIQUE LATHE AT THE TE WAIMATE MISSION NEW ZEALAND

During a recent holiday to New Zealand we took a small trip to the Te Waimate Mission Station.

This is reportedly New Zealand's first farm. It was established by the Church Missionary Society to teach British farming practices and promote ideals of Western civilisation to Maori. The scientist and evolutionist Charles Darwin stayed here for the Christmas period in 1835.

Although very interesting I was immediately drawn to the wooden lathe there. A notice described the lathe as:-

This large lathe was used to turn hubs for cartwheels. Today it is an extremely rare piece of New Zealand early machinery.

It is made from Kauri with hand forged iron components, probably by lay missionaries John Bedggood or Richard Davis. Bedggood was blacksmith, wheelwright and cartwright to the Te Waimate Mission from 1836 to 1804. In 1840 he resigned from the Mission, but remained in the area as a settler.

The lathe was housed in the wheelwrights work shop, which was next to the blacksmith's shop, some 800 meters from the Missioin house.





I was impressed with the size of the fly wheel which was about 1.5 meters diameter and the rope pulley instead of a belt. Nobody there could tell me how the lathe was powered.
